Director General's Statement

Dear readers, let me share with you some of the some of the strategic directions, performance, challenges and way forward of the Ministry in 2023.

The Ministry is currently implementing its second year of its Corporate Plan (2022 – 2025) this year 2023. The three-year corporate plan has nine priority policy objectives that is linked directly with the three pillars of the NDSP. The implementation of the corporate plan is supported by several other policies, a few sub-sectoral and multisectoral policies, regulations, and legislations that guides and ensures activities are done in a manner that is appropriately to meet expectations of this nation and its regional and international partners mandates and obligations.

MALFFB's budget trend continued to be maintained above 2 billion vatu. The growth was a blessing to the Ministry since 2019. This year's budget is VT2, 205, 326, 437 an increase of 21 million from 2022's budget. The Ministry's revenue target for this year is VT1,377,000,000 and the total revenue collected was VT925,000,000. This is 67% of revenue collection is for the first time ever, the Ministry could collect an amount and it is a 39% increase from 2022 revenue target. One of the contributing factors is the introduction of Industrial Hemp and Medical Cannabis which the Ministry had ventured into which brought into the country this revenue.

The overall performance of the Ministry this year 2023 is measured against 735 service targets and result are as follows – 49% delivered, 29% partly delivered, and 23% not delivered. There is a slight increase by 2% for activities delivered and an 8% increase in partly delivered, and a 10% reduction on activities not delivered.

There were several challenges contributing to the performance of MALFFB in 2023. One of which was the three category cyclones which caused a reprioritization of planning and budget. Political instability was another factor having 3 Ministers in one year. That caused some delay in implementation of business plan. Change in leadership of the Ministry was another hurdle. The outgoing Director General contract ended around June 2022. He was appointed on acting basis for the whole of half of 2022 and the whole of 2023. In addition, some of the Directorship positions within the Ministry also faced administrative issues of and all these contributes to the performance of the Ministry in 2023.

In an outset looking forward, the Ministry is looking into strengthening its governance through areas of institutional reviews to be robust in all resources are pulled together to support priorities of the Corporate Plan and ensuring that MALFFB maintains level of increasing its production to meet the food security and livelihood needs for the people of Vanuatu. On that note I take this opportunity to acknowledge all development partners for their support to the Vanuatu Government and MALFFB.

The Ministry worked under a very rigid budget planning system appropriated by parliament and paves the pathway that linked the NSDP that is directly linked with the following eight (8) pillars of her corporate plan (2022 – 2025)

The above eight (8) pillars are then interpreted into working objectives of the five Departments under MALFFB including Corporate Service Unit, the Cabinet office, and the Statutory Bodies housed under the Ministry guided by sectoral policies and strategies.

Term	Definition
Activities	Activities are aligned within the Programs (specified in Budget Narratives) of the Ministry to deliver the objectives of Ministry Programs. Activities should be developed, bearing in mind the challenges identified to ensure delivery strategies can be implemented. Furthermore, the activities in the Corporate Plans should not only be informed by the NSDP goals and objectives but also by any other strategic policy documents that are relevant to those areas being planned, including any Sector Plans or Recovery Strategies that are in place.
Objectives	Objectives in the Corporate Plan are the over-arching organisational goals to be reached within the main program areas of activity of the Ministry. They should derive more or less directly from the NSDP, as expressed in the Budget Narratives. 1. Introduction

This annual report for the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry, Fisheries and Biosecurity provides an understanding on the overall performance for the Ministry in 2023 fiscal year.

The Ministry was able to implement its 2023 planned activities under the guidance of its corporate plan (2022 – 2025) and its coded program budget planning system that was developed in accordance to the Vanuatu public finance and management act. The corporate plan for the Ministry has eight (8) policy objectives that is aligned to each of the five department's annual business plans. The eight (8) policy objectives include; i) increase production of diversified commodities for income generation and improving livelihoods (MAB), ii) enhance food security system for the people of Vanuatu through improved food production and livelihood for people (MAC), iii) strengthen the safety and quality of Agri, forest, animals, and fish products produced locally and imported (MAD), iv) enhance the management of natural resources at sustainable level (MAE), v) improve productive sector's resilience towards Climate Change, Natural and Human Disasters & Hazards (MAF), vi) create an inclusive productive sector through capacity building with special focus on gender and youth and marginalized (MAG), vii) strengthen institutional capacity and administration for effective service delivery to the people (MAH), and viii) improve Research & Development including data management (MAI).

This report will provide an update on all MALFFB's activities in the fiscal year 2023.

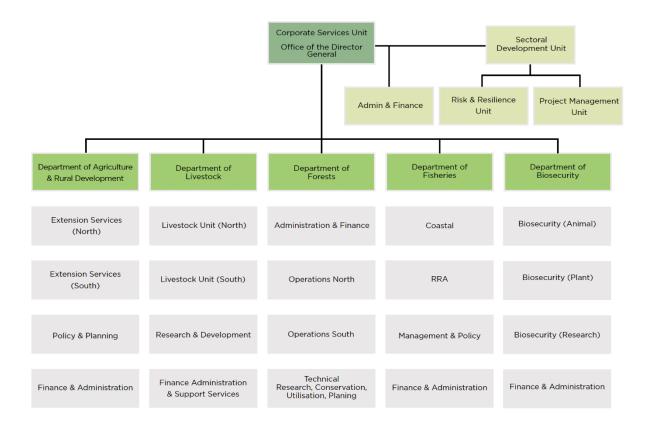

1.3 Corporate Structure

The Ministry is administered under the leadership of the Honourable Minister. The office of the cabinet is managed under the leadership of the Honourable Minister with support staff that are recruited under the Official Salaries Act.

The Office of the Corporate Service Unit (CSU) is led by the Director General who provides leadership for sections within CSU itself and the five Departments including the statutory bodies. The Departments each have Directors that manage policy matters at operational level.

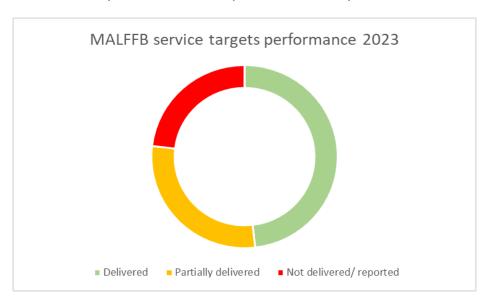

The Ministry provides equal employment opportunity from Torba to Tafea supporting the Government's priority to implement the decentralization. There are officers already on the ground however, all Departments including the Corporate Services Unit are Percentage statistics from the MALFFB Gender Equality Action Plan 2023 – 2026, approximately 24% of staff across the Ministry are women, of which a high proportion are in administration, and less in terms of officers on the ground.

4. Financial Statement

This section provides a snapshot of the overall financial performance of MALFFB in 2023. It covers total expenditures both appropriations and NPP's, and revenue for the period January to December 2023. We have reviewed the Statement of Financial Performance and the Statement of Appropriations for my Ministry for the year ended 31st December 2023 and provided the required schedules as outlined in Financial Circular 9 of 2021. We verify that:

- The Statement of Financial Performance and Statement of Appropriations fairly reflect the *Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries, Forestry and Biosecurity* financial activities for the period 1st January – 31st December 2023
- 2. All LPOs were verified as being valid as at 31st December 2023 and any duplicate, invalid or erroneous LPOs has been cancelled;
- 3. All Standing and Accountable imprests due before 31st December 2023 have been retired and fully accounted for;
- The Asset Register has been updated to the best of our ability and includes all known assets with a value of more than Vt100, 000 as at 31st December 2023
- 5. Employee leave transactions are not accurate as Smart stream has incorrect leave balances per staff. The Human Resource Manager will update the list of outstanding annual leave balances to ensure that it is valid and complete.
- 6. All known commitments, contingent liabilities and contingent assets have been identified and information submitted;
- 7. All adjustment journals have been made and passed onto the Department of Finance for approval.

The total 2023 budget ceiling allocated to MALFFB total VT2, 205,326,437 billion an increase by VT2.1 million compared to 2022 total budget.

2023 is overspent of 2.8 million, reflected in current spending rate. (Refer to table 2.0 and Table 4.0)

4.1 Expenditure

The Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry, Fisheries and Bio security (MALFFB) original 2023 budget appropriation totalled VT2,205,326,437 billion of which VT561,377,075 million to fund 2023 new project proposals (NPPs). 2023 rollover funds mainly from activities under Department of Agriculture total VT59,500,000 (Implementation of Agriculture Act/ Implementation & Enforcement of Kava Act/ Est of Soil Testing Lab and Kava implementation Act; Livestock total VT262,013,631 (

national Cattle restocking program/ Enhancing Small Livestock Dev and Boarder Management & Market access); Biosecurity Total VT9,000,000 (Manage Risk Management at Border/Strengthen Biosecurity Meat Inspector); further produced an overall roll over budget VT336,588,409 million.

Thus far, total acquittals amounted VT2.2 billion, 96.3 per cent of budget has been expended

Budget transfers or virement between respective cost centers within MALFFB totals VT207,3 million. A full breakdown of MALFFB's expenditure reports are provided on the next page.

Program budget analysis

Salary and payroll related cost absorbed 97.94 per cent of total budget 2023, 106 per cent to operations. Operation budget outweighs payroll budget by 4 per cent, contributed by European Union budget support, 11th EDF. This portion differs in 2021, 2022, where currently 54 per cent of 2023 budget ceiling weighs more on payroll side while 46 per cent to operations. This ratio again may change once approved new projects are factored in. (Refer to Figure: 1.0)

NPP Overview

As previously mentioned, 2023 NPPs claimed a budget of VT561.3 million to which MALFFB advanced VT526 million or 93.7 per cent. (Detailed NPPs under next heading)

Current NPP

A 93.7per cent of total 2023 NPP budget has been executed or advanced. VT35 million is rolled over to 2024 Budget being for the Biosecurity Mini Slaughter House in Santo.

100 per cent or VT50 million supplementary budget has been utilized. 35 million have been roll over to 2024 toward Biosecurity Mini Slaughter House in Santo. The reason that CTB meeting that we anticipate to take place on this day 11th December 2023 to deliberate and make a decision on the outcome of the Mini Slaughter House in Santo did not eventuate as planned.

4.2 Revenue

The Ministry collected 68% cent of its projected revenue amounting to VT925 million, against VT1.377 billion revenue budget. Major revenue items being Industrial Hemp and Medical Cannabis Licenses, Fishing Licenses & Registration. This strongly demonstrates that the more Government invests into the Ministry through budgetary support, the more revenue it will collect and this is evident at a very difficult time when 3 category cyclones hit the shore of Vanuatu.

5. Statutory Authorities

The Vanuatu Government through MALFFB established a total of several state authorities. The statutory authorities are established and governed under their own acts. Those statutory bodies include Vanuatu Primary Producers Authority, Vanuatu Agriculture Research Training Centre, Vanuatu Agriculture College, Vanuatu Livestock Development project, International Forestry Project, and Metenesel Cacao Project.

6. Non-Statutory Bodies

The Ministry currently has two non statutory bodies. They include the SINOVAN project and VanFly project.

The SINOVAN project is a joint venture project between Vanuatu Government and China National Fisheries Cooperation (CNFC) whereby Government owns 49% shares and CNFC owns 51% shares of that local company. The purpose of the company is to fish tuna in Vanuatu's EEZ, process and value add them, and sell both locally and overseas markets. The company faced a lot of challenges therefore could only partly deliver its purpose.

VanFly is another local company owned by Vanuatu Government and Flysha Ltd. Their purpose is to develop sea cucumber fishery. There was no records during preparation of this report.

Both Flysha and SINOVAN are fisheries related non-statutory bodies.

7. Reports by the Auditor General

There were no reports by the Auditor General received during the preparation of this report.

8. Comments by the Ombudsman

There were no reports by Office of the Ombudsman during preparation of this report.

9. Right to Information

There no information on rights to information during preparation of this report.

10. Decisions of Courts

There no information on court decisions during preparation of this report.

11. Complaints Mechanisms

There were several complaints regarding works of the Ministry. Two of the main ones include the Spanish Mackrel quota in the South Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Organization and the two Vietnamese vessels that were brought in to the country. There were Commission of Inquiries (COI) on both the issues. The Spanish Mackrel case has pending court issues whilst the Vietnamese vessels had gone through the COI process and awarded licenses to fish within Vanuatu waters.

The Forestry's wind-fell timber trees is another complaint received by the Ministry in 2023.

There may be others but not reported. The reason could be that no complaint mechanisms developed.

12. Equity

The Ministry promotes gender equality across the sector. This year 2023 was a milestone not be forgotten because for the very first time, Ministry for the first time developed a Gender Action Plan. Purpose of the plan is to guide the decision of promoting gender within all works of the Ministry and ensuring no one is left behind, especially the vulnerable and needy population of the country.

LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT

The Department of Livestock is the implementation agency of the cattle restocking project and pasture Water improvement project which are the major activities of EDF11 Beef value chain Programs these projects aim to increase cattle production throughout Vanuatu

The year 2023 Cattle Development is a national Government policy introduced with an objective to livestock Farmers throughout Vanuatu, to improve cattle breeds and increase production to 500 thousand cattle heads by 2030 which will allow Vanuatu to increase its cattle Productions this program focus on 6 islands of Vanuatu which allow farmers have access on cattle's breeds that never happen Before, below list of major activities implemented

Cattle Restocking Activity

One of the priority activities under the Cattle Development program is restocking. this year 2023 is Sanma livestock team successfully restocked and selected cattle farms with improved cattle breeds. The farmers were selected based on the program criteria and their farms were assessed prior to the distribution of cattle. In total, 550 heads of cattle distributed to 204 farmers from across South East Santo to Big Bay Santo.

SANMA Farmer Field School

The activities carried under the two programs are Field school training which is part of the Business plan. The livestock training and field school were organised and carried out with Five (5) established farmers' associations registered under the Financial Service Commission during the months of September and October. through the extension service—support under EDF11 funding, the success of these five livestock associations were able to participate in NWA at Lakatoro with a successful outcome. Training and field school at the Port Olry and Loran area covers Animal Husbandry techniques, animal health/pasture development and market access including awareness to promote or shift smallholder farmers from small scale to commercial farmers.

PENAMA Farmer Field School

The Farmer Field School training focuses on providing information on the management and health of cattle, goats, non-ruminants, as well as pasture management and the construction of holding yards. In April, we gathered approximately 65 farmers from Ambae to participate in the Livestock Field Day. This event included indoor discussions, field trips to farms, practical demonstrations, and open discussions with farmers who shared their unique farming experiences.

During the Livestock Field Day, farmers actively engaged in discussions and learned about various aspects of farming.

The indoor sessions involve informative discussions led by livestock officers. Farmers had the opportunity to ask questions, seek advice, and gain valuable insights into improving their livestock management practices

Cattle Development Program & Activities

The Livestock Department would like to express its gratitude to EDF11 for their generous financial support, which has enabled us to upgrade the Tagabe Farm holding yard for cattle. This improvement has greatly enhanced our operations and facilities. Within the stockyard, there are four main areas: the line way, holding area, gulluse, and loading ramp. Each of these spaces serves a crucial purpose in the management of livestock.

The holding yard plays a vital role as it allows livestock officers to carry out essential husbandry practices, including dehorning, castration, vaccination, and providing medical treatment to sick animals. This ensures the overall health and well-being of our livestock population. The loading ramp within the holding yard serves as a crucial point where animals are safely loaded onto transportation vehicles bound for the abattoir. This process ensures the efficient and humane transfer of livestock for processing.

Field School Training

In December, LDCO Epi, Brian Dickson conducted a field school for cattle farmers. The purpose of the field school was to raise awareness about the health and production of cattle, while also emphasizing the importance of constructing a proper stockyard for the animals.

A model stockyard was built as an example to inspire all farmers participating in the cattle restocking program to have their own stockyard in order to receive cattle. This initiative aimed to enhance animal handling practices, ensuring safety and promoting humane treatment.

Small Ruminant Development

Small Ruminant Development program is a NPP Supported by the EDF11 VAVAC project to develop and strengthening the small ruminant program across Vanuatu. The program is established because of its symbiotic relationship to cattle. Small ruminant plays an important role in the food and nutritional security of many people in rural with small area of land, marginal and small farmers in most remote parts of Vanuatu. The socio-economic value of small ruminant rearing as compared to other livestock species is immense. Perhaps, the advantage of small ruminant relatives to large ruminant is their low cost, small size, their sustainability to small holding and their purpose to meat and milk. Small ruminant program is developed to provide beef substitute available to consumers that may provide some measure of relief on the demand and subsequently the price for beef locally

According to the mini-agriculture census in 2016, there was a total of 16,288 goats in Vanuatu.

However, national statistics on the number of goats and sheep are out dated and inconsistent. Goat farming is not common compare to cattle, since most farmers rear goat as a means of plantation and bush clearing activity. However, during the agriculture event (Show), it shows that there is a high number of goat farmers throughout Vanuatu. Goat demand is high but the supply is low.

The Program aims to increase the number of small ruminant herds in the country, thereby encouraging interested farmers to engage in small ruminant farming. Farmers are selected according to the program's criteria. This year, the Small Ruminant Program has expanded its development in supporting the improvement of goat farms, conducting trainings and surveillances, animal health awareness, distribute goat breeds, farming materials and surveys

Pasture and Water Improvement Program

Pasture and water improvement are the major activities of EDF11 Value chain Program these program aims to increase cattle production throughout Vanuatu by improving pasture quality in small farmers that include fencing Pasture Establishment and Fencing pasture rehabilitation within islands of Vanuatu

Malekula Pasture demonstration plots were established in three (3) areas at Malekula. These areas of pasture plots include; Mapbest, Lakatoro and North West B. Vegetative cuttings of mulato, signal and panicum were collected and planted in those pasture plots.

AMBRYM

Ambrym field officer packaging pasture seeds (glycine and signal) in preparation for distribution. This year pasture seed packaging and distribution was carried out at Ambrym. Pasture seeds includes glycine and signal, which were weighed and distributed to 11 lead key farmers of cattle in West Ambrym.

SHEFA

Shefa The pasture development program focuses on increasing livestock farms with improved pastures. In Shefa, the department distributed pasture seeds of signal and glycine to the islands

ERROMANGO

Erromango, Tarol Nentu (LDCO) conducted a pasture field day to demonstrate how to prepare pasture seeds with saw dust before applying the seeds onto the field. The field day was organised in Cooks Bay and the team sowed signal and glycine seeds over one hectare. Apart from sowing seeds, the farmers were taught also how to plant vegetative cuttings of pasture such as signal grass.

TANNA

Tanna, PLO Thomas laru and the contract students establish a one hectare each plot for signal and glycine. The photos above shows the growth of signal and legume after 3 months and cattle are also rotated into these new pasture plots for grazing

Bee Development

The department of livestock is focusing of Cattle production programs, and likewise to assist with the Honey bee Project to help farmers

Cattle Fencing Improvement

Cattle fencing is a crucial contribution towards livestock operation in terms of farming to increase production and meet all established goas. By utilizing fencing materials, farmers can maximise their output and ensure that their objectives are met in a timely and efficient manner.

• Livestock Water system Improvement

Livestock water access is a critical factor that is closely linked to production. Its purpose is to ensure permanent access to high-quality water on livestock farms, thereby enhancing productivity.

This year 2023 Monbiftek farm at South East area council, Shapy area is a thirty-eight (38) hectare of land and is a government-owned farm under livestock farming purposely to farm cattle, non-Ruminant, and Ruminant animals. Unfortunately, there is no water access for both Animal and human usage, the current water is pumped a distance from the normal supply at Shapy area to where it is now. This project supplies 7 paddocks around the 38-hectare and also office uses, a permanent broader, and breeding units for both piggery and poultry units.

AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT

Coconut Programs

Department of Agriculture, and rural Development (DARD) is Carrying out the Coconut Replanting program as one of the EDF11 Activities under the coconut implementation programs NPP, the target for the Coconut replanting program as stated in the coconut strategy is 100,000 coconut seed nuts should be distributed and planted out in Vanuatu

In 2023, the national target was divided by provinces and area councils in addition to the few applications received for the interested farmers. This approach of dividing the national targets by area councils led to establishments of central nurseries which means that there is a mixed approach to selecting farms and farmers planting less than 143 seedlings are also considered in order to reach the target.

Challenges

- 1. It would seem that there is still a misunderstanding of the terms, seed nut/seedling distributed and seedlings planted. Or perhaps a lack of understanding of the indicator for the activity 47CB which is "the number of seedlings planted", or perhaps it is the assumption that whatever quantity of seedling that is distributed is actually planted and therefore recorded as planted. This causes confusion when reporting the figures as was observed during the year.
- 2. Lack of field visits to the farmers and farm sites. Farmers involved in the planting often require the technical support such as for field marking which resulted in farmers not applying the standard planting spacing of 9m x 9m.

Recommendations

- (i) Improve communication between the program coordinator and the field officers to better understand the requirements for reporting as per the annual reporting matrix.
- (ii) Improve the reporting of accountable imprests such as on the incomplete activities including a budget that could be covered in another imprest application.
- (iii) Better coordination of the activities and setting timeframes for field visitation to each eligible farmers to provide trainings and assist with field marking.

Fruit and Vegetable

EDF11 through DARD Continuous narrative for increasing of fruits trees production in Vanuatu for export and domestic market purpose including food security, has prompt for more production of fruits tree seedling and to encourage and assist local nurseries in their product by purchasing machineries to assist in local market production and Packaging, trainings, building seed bank to provinces and procure of Fruits tree from farmers

The main Objective for EDF11 is to work together with DARD to increase and strengthen Fruit and Vegetable production and Quality.

Means of service delivery:

- 1. Establish and maintain seed banks in all provinces
- 2. Import new genetic materials of fruits and vegetables for propagation
- 3. Engage private sector in nursery production and distribution
- 4. Conduct training in production technologies
- 5. Attend Fruit and Vegetable industry Working Group meeting

Six provincial seedbanks were constructed in each province. Malampa, Tafea, and Penama are completed while Torba is still waiting for the shipment of its roofing from Santo. Shefa and Sanma seedbank are almost to completion. Three of the seedbanks for Tafea, Shefa and Sanma also has started the fencing of the seedbanks and bathroom facility which will end by January 2024. Seedbanks construction is to target the countries seed sustainability especially to address disasters cause by yearly cyclones. Each seedbank consists of a nursery, Greenhouse, Seed storage drier and multiplication plot.

• Urban Food Garden Program

This year the Department of Agriculture through its Urban Backyard Garden project, which is a rollover from 2021 NPP approved by Parliament under the Program, has confirmed to establish 10 new backyard gardens and provide trainings and basic gardening tools within the selected community project sites. There are key interested farmers that works well with the project and had proven themselves key role models in each community. The Backyard program has also reach out to other islands outside the two main urban centres with high interest. Thus, priority focus is to continue support the champion farmers as part of food security and livelihoods promotion through backyard gardening. Also, it will support the Provincial Seedbanks additional cost a priority program through the Fruits and Vegetables sector. These activities are a component of the Urban Food Garden Project support by the 11th EDF program with a budget allocation of 20 million Vatu. The project will be used to pay for provision of gardening tools, seeds, organic fertilizer fencing and water tank materials to support the Urban Backyard program in Port Vila and Luganville.
